DT: Structures


We will be looking at textiles and celtic weaving.

Glossary of key vocabulary

This is a list of some of the key vocabulary for the learning this term.

Place Value is the **value** of each digit in a number. It means understanding that 582 is made up of 500, 80 and 2, rather than 5, 8 and 2.

Addition the process of calculating the total of two or more numbers or amounts.

Bullet Points A symbol to show items in a list.

Prefixes Letter/s added to the beginning of a root word to change the meaning. For example, unkind, **un** is the prefix .

Adverbs These add information to the verb. E.g. The friendly child

Suffixes Letter/s added to the end of a root word to change the meaning. For example, painted, **-ed** is the suffix

Proper nouns A noun referring to a particular person, place of thing, for example, Sally, London, Tuesday, May. They usually have a capital letter.
